v / **x REFERENCES AND PLAGIARISM** 1 Ensure your paper is free of plagiarism. 2 All references listed in the reference section should be cited in the body-text of the paper. 3 Cite at least five to 10 recently published research works in the reference section to support your work. 4 Any tables and figures reproduced or adapted from previously published works must be referenced. **TITLE (FOR MORE INFORMATION SEE PAGE 2)** 5 Do not phrase the title as a question. Rephrase your title to answer or at least allude to the answer. 6 Ensure the title is long enough that it identifies the topic, argument, and method of the essay. **ABSTRACT AND KEYWORDS** 7 The abstract should include an introductory statement that outlines the background and significance of the study, the methodologies, as well as the major findings of the study. 8 Do not cite any references, figures, equations, or tables in the abstract. 9 At least four keywords or phrases should be given in alphabetical order. FIGURES, TABLES, AND EQUATIONS 10 All figures should be captioned. 11 Figures should use a high enough resolution to be easily readable at a glance. 12 Text remarks in your figures should be in English. 13 All tables should be captioned. 14 All equations have to be written by Equation Editor. 15 Please number all equations orderly. **GENERAL** 16 The abstract, as well as the paper, MUST NOT be written in first person. **17** Please proofread your paper for any grammatical mistakes, typos, spelling mistakes and missing punctuation. 18 The affiliation section should appear at the bottom of the first page on the left and must include at least the corresponding author's e-mail. 19 Full text papers should be at least four full pages after formatting according to the WASET Template Paper at: http://waset.org/downloads/template.docx (MS Word Users) / http://waset.org/downloads/latex.zip (LaTeX Users). 20 Prepare Blind and PDF versions of your paper for submission with .docx (MS Word Users) or .rar (LaTeX Users) file extensions.

COMMON MISTAKES FOR THE TITLES

 Titles should be STRONG/CLEAR/CONCISE: It contributes to the arguments developed and informs and/or convinces readers, identifies the topic, and demonstrates the author's understanding of the question or concept discussed. It identifies the topic, argument and method of the essay, captures the reader's attention and interest by giving them an idea of what the essay is about.

Make clear what your main argument is:

Do not phrase a title as a question. Rephrase your title to answer or at least allude to the answer:

CORRECT	Analyzing the Perception of Key Terms in E-Learning in Academia: Case Study of Princess Nourah Bint Abdulrahman University	

2) **DO NOT USE "New, Novel, or Innovative" in the title:** Give the name of the method/approach.

WRONG	A New/Innovative/Novel Approach for Automatic Generation Control of Two-Area

CORRECT	Hybrid Neuro Fuzzy Approach for Automatic Generation Control of Two-Area Interconnected

3) Use binomial nomenclature for species' names and be careful for Latin words:

WRONG	In Vivo Effect of Escherichia Coli in Growth Hormones of Glycine Max
CORRECT	In <mark>vivo</mark> Effect of Escherichia <mark>coli</mark> in Growth Hormones of Glycine <mark>max</mark>

4) Write the title in "Title Case-Capitalize Each Word": Correct the capitalization of prepositions, chemical names, and abbreviations.

WRONG	TEM ANALYSIS OF ZN ADDITION TO TIO2 NANOPARTICLES (Don't Write in Upper Case)
